Chancellor's Report:

ARC: American River College is excited to put its new Culinary Arts Building in the spotlight on January 29 and 30. On Thursday evening, January 29, the college will host a special thank you event for donors who have generously supported the project. This is an opportunity to show appreciation for those who have given their support. The next morning, on January 30, ARC will hold a public ceremony with speakers, a ribbon cutting and self-guided tours of the facility.

CRC: Cosumnes River College Music Professor Kurt Erickson has been invited to perform later this month at UCLA at the Gala Concert of the Voice Studies Now Conference. The event, on January 28 and 29, is co-sponsored by the Oxford Handbook of Voice Studies. Professor Erickson will be performing several of his original compositions with internationally renowned countertenor Brian Asawa. Asawa was the first countertenor to ever win the New York Metropolitan Opera's National Council Award. Professor Erickson has also been chosen from among nearly 100 entrants around the country as the winner of the Emerging Composer Competition, which is sponsored by the Berkeley Community Chorus and Orchestra. He has been commissioned to write a new work for the organization's 50th Anniversary Celebration. The work will be finished this summer with rehearsals and performances scheduled for the fall.

FLC: The Folsom Lake College women's soccer team clinched its second consecutive Bay Valley Conference Championship in December. Many of the team members were also recognized individually for their efforts this season. Two Lady Falcons received national accolades from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). Captain Rozzlyn Sovereign was selected to the 2014 NSCAA Women's Junior College Division Scholar All-American 2nd Team, recognizing her dual accomplishments on the field and in the classroom. Additionally, Michelle Kimbell was named to the 2014 NSCAA/Continental Tire Junior College Division III Women's All-West Region Team. The California Community College Athletic Association's Bay Valley Conference named its 2014 Women's Soccer All-Conference teams, as well as the conference's Players and Coaches of the Year. Those honored included 10 Folsom Lake College players and head coach Donny Ribaudo.

<u>SCC:</u> Aeronautics Professor Scott Miller has developed into our region's go-to aviation expert for the news media. Numerous news outlets have interviewed him regarding the recent AirAsia flight 8501 that vanished in the South Pacific with more than 150 on board. Professor Miller

expects that weather played a major role in the plane's disappearance. He has personally flown on AirAsia before, and said the carrier's reputation is a good one.
