

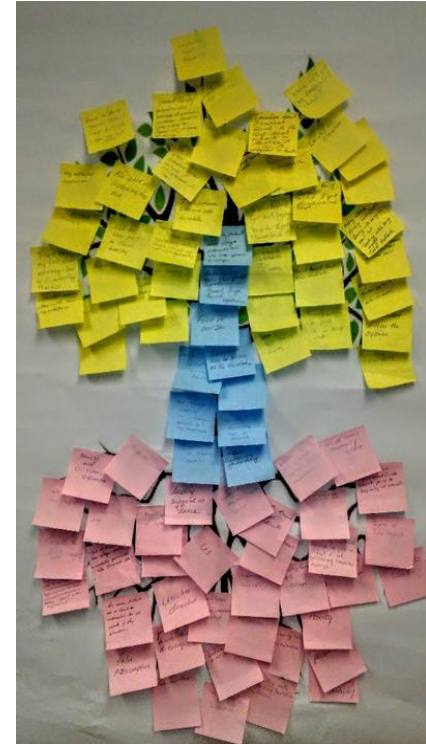

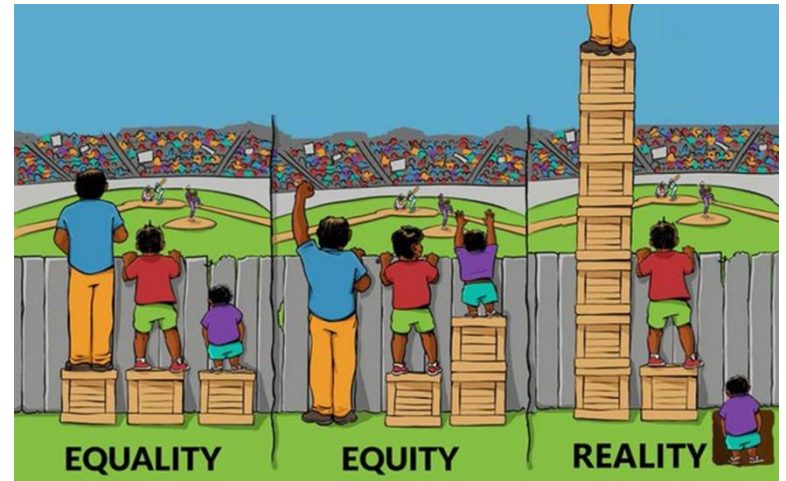
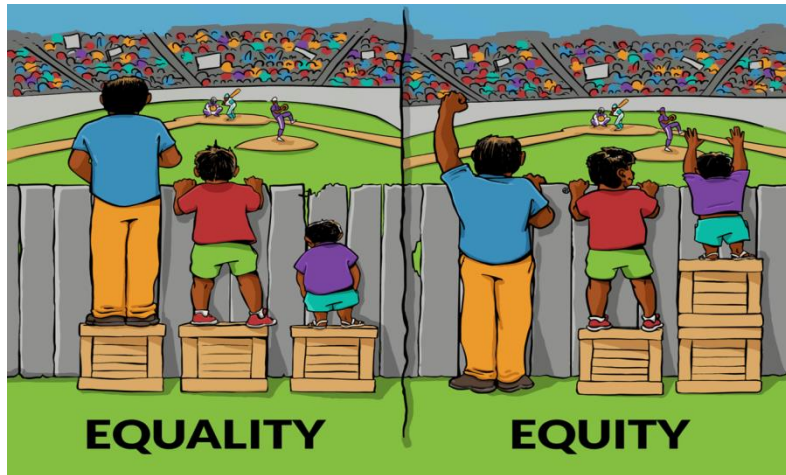
- What is the potential Scalability of the EICAP?
