Chancellor's Report:

ARC: ARC student athlete Cody Duong was chosen by coaches around the nation as the recipient of the prestigious 2017 Arthur Ashe Award in collegiate tennis. The Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award is given to students who have proven themselves to be outstanding, committed, and hardworking members of their team and outside communities. The award is given in association with the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) and is targeted towards college-level tennis players across the nation. Cody is also a three time All-American winner, making him ARC's first student to receive these awards. Cody also won several ITA preseason tournaments in both the singles and doubles division during his time at ARC.

<u>CRC:</u> This year's CRC-CPPE Ethics Symposium, The Ethics of Saying Things: Free Speech on American College Campuses was another great success. More than 600 people attended. The symposium's presenters were highly complementary regarding the quality of CRC's students' questions, the depth and civility of our students' engagement, and our students' openness to new ideas. Student feedback regarding the event has been overwhelmingly positive as well. Portions of the event will be broadcast by the Sacramento Educational Cable Consortium and video of the entire event will become available via the CPPE's video archive. The CRC-CPPE Fall Ethics Symposium Series, now in its 12th year, is supported by a partnership between CRC and the Sacramento State University Center for Practical and Professional Ethics (CPPE).

FLC: Folsom Lake College students Nathaniel Adams and Rebekah Keely have been selected for the prestigious University Innovation Fellows program run by Stanford University's Hasso Plattner Institute of Design. They now join the cohort of 229 students representing 62 higher education institutions from ten countries. University Innovation Fellows work at their home campuses to ensure that their peers gain the knowledge, skills, and attitudes required to compete in the economy of the future and make a positive impact on the world. To accomplish this, Fellows advocate for lasting institutional change and create opportunities for students to engage with innovation, entrepreneurship, design thinking, and creativity at their schools.

SCC: Sacramento City College's Chicano and Latino Male Scholars Dinner on Friday, Dec. 8, was a hit! About 150 Chicano and Latino male students and community leaders attended the dinner, which aimed to connect mentors with students who have shown potential for success. The dinner provided a unique networking opportunity for students who would greatly benefit from increased engagement with local leaders and industry partners that have shared similar

experiences and overcome challenges to achieve their goals. This supports and motivates these students to succeed in their classes and consider transferring to four-year universities.

LOS RIOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Annual Statement of Legislative Principles

This Statement of Legislative Principles is adopted by the Board of Trustees for the Los Rios Community College District on behalf of itself and its four separately accredited Colleges (American River College, Cosumnes River College, Folsom Lake College and Sacramento City College) under Board Policy P-3115. This Statement is intended to support the District's Strategic Goals: to establish effective pathways that optimize student access and success; to ensure equitable academic achievement across all racial, ethnic, socioeconomic and gender groups; to provide exemplary teaching and learning opportunities; to lead the region in workforce development; and to foster an outstanding working and learning environment.

This Statement of Legislative Principles provides guidelines for the Chancellor when addressing matters before the California Legislature and Congress, and constitutes the core principles guiding the development of the District's position on legislation.

The District shall not support or oppose legislation unless the outcome will have a significant effect on the District, its students or its employees. The District will remain neutral on most matters affecting local collective bargaining. However, the District will take appropriate positions where that legislation will have a material impact on the District. The District will remain neutral on matters affecting only another single district or small group of district(s), except where policy precedents, or resource allocations, have the significant potential of affecting the Los Rios Community College District or the California Community College System generally. Where issues are raised in the budget process, the District shall seek legislative support or opposition in accordance with the principles established in this document. Where legislation is likely to impede the policy principles set forth, the District is likely to oppose that legislation unless there are significant countervailing reasons.

The Board of Trustees' Legislative Principles align with the District's Vision, Mission, Values, Goals and Strategies, as enumerated in the District's Strategic Plan, as follows, but do not reflect every strategy under each goal area. The District will support those legislative efforts enumerated under each Goal.

1. ESTABLISH EFFECTIVE PATHWAYS THAT OPTIMIZE STUDENT ACCESS AND SUCCESS.

- Obtain resources to support pathway programs.
- Implement appropriate measures to improve student success.
- Support the provision of comprehensive student support services.
- Strengthen the academic preparation of K-12 students to support success at a community college.
- Support collaborative efforts with four-year institutions designed to provide additional transfers for our students and legislation that promotes transfers.

- Support flexibility for dual enrollment and remove barriers as appropriate.
- Enhance student financial aid opportunities (including, but not limited to, Cal Grant Funding and Promise Programs) and reduce the overall cost of attending college for students.
- Assist students with the application process for attending a community college.
- Support the enhancement of existing educational programs and the development of needed new programs.
- Support high quality distance education while minimizing regulatory barriers and additional reporting requirements.

2. ENSURE EQUITABLE ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT ACROSS ALL RACIAL, ETHNIC, SOCIOECONOMIC AND GENDER GROUPS.

- Close the achievement gap.
- Support the Dream Act and efforts to expand the institutional capacity for diversity.
- Increase effective delivery of English, ESL and mathematics basic skills education.
- Enhance opportunities for underserved constituencies.

3. PROVIDE EXEMPLARY TEACHING AND LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES.

• Support professional development for faculty, staff and administrators that is designed to support student success inside and outside of the classroom.

4. LEAD THE REGION IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

- Develop effective and relevant career and technical programs in collaboration with external partners.
- Increase efforts that align career technical education curriculum and program development among community colleges, K-12 and industry.
- Integrate community colleges in the Workforce Investment Board and provide for community college courses to qualify for state and federal funding of workforce development activities.
- Support the efforts of the Los Rios Foundation in its efforts to develop additional funding resources for the District, Colleges, faculty, staff and students.

5. FOSTER AN OUTSTANDING WORKING AND LEARNING ENVIRONMENT.

- Maintain local authority and control in the administration of the District and its Colleges.
- Maintain locally elected Board of Trustee governance in the administration of the District and its Colleges.

- Promote the health, safety and welfare of students, faculty, staff and administrators, including mental health.
- Support the District's and its Colleges' efforts to attract, recruit and retain the most qualified employees, and assure appropriate staffing levels.
- Support participatory decision making.
- Increase the District's efforts in sustainable practices, including energy and resource conservation, while retaining appropriate flexibility.
- Strengthen the District's ability to use its capital outlay, infrastructure bonds and property management funds efficiently.
- Support the elimination of duplicative and/or needless regulatory oversight and reporting obligations, and provide adequate funding for the oversight and reporting requirements that are necessary.
- Protect the fiscal integrity of the system.
- Support funding sustainable mechanisms for CalSTRS and CalPERS liabilities.
- Support backfill of property tax shortfalls.
- Provide information and support for students, faculty, staff and administrators in the DACA programs to support inclusivity and ensure that the District and its Colleges remain a place where all students are provided with an opportunity to fulfill their educational goals and dreams.
- Support a model for alignment of accreditation that improves outcomes for our students.

BACKGROUND:

The President of the United States declared a major disaster making federal disaster aid available to 34 counties in California for the January 2017 winter storms. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) authorizes the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) to administer a disaster relief program that provides financial assistance from the state for costs incurred by local agencies as a result of the disaster event. The state Public Assistance Program provides funding to cities, counties, special districts, school districts, and community colleges. For a public entity to receive funding from the state, the entity must file OES Form 130 (Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution) with CalOES. The form is used to file a resolution designating an applicant's authorized representative to whom all official correspondence and funding from the state will be directed.

STATUS:

The Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution, Form 130, on file with the state is not current and needs to be updated. The current resolution form is attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the attached Office of Emergency Services resolution that will designate the District's authorized representatives to receive official correspondence and funding from the state as the result of a disaster event where the District may be eligible for state financial assistance.

BACKGROUND:

The Education Code regulates the procedures by which a community college district can dispose of real and personal property. Education Code section 81452 provides that the governing board may, by unanimous vote, dispose of items valued at \$5,000 or less by private sale without advertising or selling the items at public auction. The District has held previous auctions, but they have generally cost more than they have netted for the District. In 1998, the District began transferring such surplus items to the State of California since the cost to store and sell such surplus items is greater than potential revenues.

STATUS:

The District has a quantity of surplus materials that need to be disposed of, such as outdated desks and computers. The State of California has accepted some of the surplus items, but will not take surplus items deemed unsaleable. The District has located a scrap dealer who will take the remaining surplus items for recycling.

The surplus items to be disposed of are either irreparable, obsolete, in poor condition or not needed for district/college operations and include the following: 20 computers; 1 data unit; 1 drill stand; 1 incubator; 5 lab scopes; 10 laptops; 1 media cart; 1 optical planimeter; 3 overhead projectors; 1 printer; 1 refrigerator; 1 server; 9 surveying instruments; 11 transit levels and 1 transit survey.

These items have a value of less than \$5,000.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Government Code Section 3547, et seq., all initial proposals of exclusive representatives of recognized employee groups and of the District are required to be presented at a public meeting of the District.

The Board and representatives of the Los Rios Supervisors Association (LRSA) have agreed to engage in an interest-based collaborative approach to negotiations. The collective bargaining agreement with LRSA expires on June 30, 2018. The parties wish to commence negotiations as soon as possible, with the goal of attempting to reach agreement as early as possible before the contract expires.

Consistent with the applicable code sections, the public has a right to be informed of those areas that the parties will be negotiating and to invite public comment at a meeting of the public school employer.

STATUS:

Consistent with local regulations, on December 13, 2017, the Board of Trustees scheduled a public hearing for the January 10, 2018 meeting to allow public comments regarding the collective bargaining proposals. The enclosed initial collective bargaining proposals for LRSA and the District have been available for public review since being presented to the Board of Trustees at the December 13, 2017 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees conduct a public hearing, receive the initial collective bargaining proposals of LRSA and the District, and adopt the District's proposal.

Los Rios Supervisor's Association Sunshine Letter for Collective Bargaining Initiation LRSA Contract 2018-2021

The Los Rios Supervisor's Association values the communication and transparency that have, and continue to be foundational to the mutually beneficial relationship between the supervisors and the District. We ask that this letter serve as official notification of our interest to enter negotiations for our 2018 collective bargaining agreement. Further, we recognize the value of an interest based approach, and wish to make use of this method as it is reflective of our values and shared common culture.

Article 1 - Recognition

LRSA has an interest in adding a section to define key terms.

Article 5 - Personnel Policies

LRSA has an interest in discussing the professional growth of supervisory employees.

Article 7 – Work Schedules

LRSA has an interest in discussing supervisor's overtime and call back criteria and related compensation and vehicle assignment and usage.

Article 8 - Leaves with Pay

LRSA has an interest in discussing supervisor's use and accrual of sick leave, vacation, and birth of child leave.

Article 10 - Compensation Salary & Benefits

LRSA has an interest in discussing longevity increments and special compensation.

Article 11 - Fringe Benefits and Insurance Programs

LRSA has an interest in discussing health and welfare benefits for current employees and retirees.

Article 13 – Safety

LRSA has an interest in discussing police uniforms.

MOU's:

LRSA has an interest in reviewing any MOU's completed during the 2015-2018 contract period for potential incorporation into the 2018-2021 contract.

Alignment:

LRSA has an interest in updating and aligning any general relational language between the current LRCEA/SEIU contracts and the pending 2018-2021 contract.

BACKGROUND:

The District and employee groups periodically review job classifications for currency. At times, the result of the review may include a change in placement. The LRCEA and SEIU agreements include formal processes to review classifications for those units. Separately, salary schedule placement changes may be recommended to align relative to other positions, due to organizational changes, or a significant change in scope. Following negotiations with LRCEA and discussions with Confidential employees, the District is recommending salary schedule revisions, new classifications, and placement changes for certain classifications in those employee groups. Lastly, the management salary schedule is revised to increase the "B" and "C" ranges by 4%.

STATUS:

As indicated in the attached memorandum of understanding, the LRCEA and the District have agreed to add a third level to the Administrative Assistant Series and to reclassify certain positions as appropriate effective to 7/1/17.

The Confidential salary schedule is proposed to be expanded by four additional ranges along with placement changes for certain positions. In addition, four new job classifications are added to the unit. These new classifications will not result in additional positions. Incumbents in existing positions will be reclassified from existing positions.

Placement changes for employees who will be placed in a new or a revised classification are shown in the Human Resources Transactions agenda item.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve effective to 7/1/17 the following 2017-18 interim salary schedules: LRCEA Classified Salary Schedule, Confidential Employees Salary Schedule, and Management Salary Schedule and Board approval of the memorandum of understanding with LRCEA.

LOS RIOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT Memorandum of Understanding LRCEA

Background

The LRCEA contract includes provisions for review of the unit's job classifications. The purpose of the review is to ensure that job descriptions are current and accurately reflect the duties of each classification. Although the purpose of the review does not include changes to placement, it can result in changes based upon organizational needs.

During the review of the current family, discussion occurred regarding the assignment of administrative assistants and the designation within the district of certain administrative assistant positions as Confidential positions.

The committee recommendation is to add a third level to the AA classification. This third level will be assigned to VP positions and above except where a Confidential AA is warranted. The current AAII position will be assigned to AVP and Director I positions.

As current Confidential AA positions are vacated, those positions will be converted to Administrative Assistant III classifications as appropriate.

The cost for the change is estimated around \$36,500 and will be borne equally by the District and the LRCEA.

The following is agreed to:

Creation of a new job classification, Administrative Assistant III at range 30. Current AA's reporting to VPs or higher will be reclassified to the AAIII effective 7/1/17. The placement will be at the step that provides at least a 4% improvement.

Current AAIs reporting to AVPS or equivalent and Director I positions will be reclassified to AAII with placement at the step that provides at least a 4% improvement effective 7/1/17.

The continuing cost for the classification changes will be borne as follows: the general purpose funded portion of any positions will be shared by the District and LRCEA 50:50. The cost for the classification change of any positions funded by categorical or restricted funds will be funded by the programs. The general purpose LRCEA portion will be charged against 2017-18 on-going funds and the LRCEA will be credited with one-time resources for the cost for the period of 7/1/17 to 6/30/18.

The District will fund the full cost of the reclassification for the period of 7/1/17 to 12/31/17 as a one-time expenditure.

Educational Stipend: An educational stipend of \$3,387 will be provided to managers possessing an earned doctorate completed at an accredited institution or fully accredited in accordance with the American Bar Association or the California Bar Association. Accredited institution includes a postsecondary institution accredited by an accreditation agency recognized by either the U.S. Department of Education or the Council on Postsecondary and Vocational Education. The stipend amount is equivalent to the difference between Step 6 Class IV and Step 6 Class V on the LRCFT Salary Schedule A.

After 10 years of full-time service with Los Rios, a longevity increment will be awarded which will be 4% of the appropriate range and step.

An Additional 4% (8.16%) increment will be awarded after 15 years.

An Additional 2% (10.323%) increment will be awarded after 20 years.

The second and third longevity increments will be based on current step placement plus previously earned longevity increments (rate compounded).

BACKGROUND:

Education Code 76140 requires governing boards to establish a nonresident tuition fee for the succeeding fiscal year no later than February 1st of each year. Since the District does not receive any State funds for the education of out-of-state and international students, the District is required to assess these students for the cost of their education.

As prescribed in statute, the governing board may choose between these six (6) specified fee calculation options:

- Los Rios' Current Expense for Education (CEE) per unit of Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) for 2016-17, increased by the projected compounded factor for the increase in the U.S. Consumer Price Index (USCPI) for the current and succeeding fiscal years (twoyear-period).
- 2. The statewide average CEE per unit of FTES (2016-17) increased by the two-year projected USCPI increase.
- 3. A unit rate no greater than a contiguous district's established rate.
- 4. A unit rate greater than the statewide average and less than the district's calculated rate. (This option is only available to districts whose calculated rate is greater than the statewide average rate.)
- 5. Highest statewide calculated average rate for the succeeding, current and the past four years (highest calculated rate during these six years).
- 6. No more than the average of the nonresident tuition fees of public community colleges in no less than 12 states that are comparable to California in cost of living.

Districts may also elect to charge a capital outlay fee to nonresident students.

The District's 2017-18 nonresident tuition is \$234 per unit and the 2017-18 capital outlay fee is \$16 per unit.

The rates proposed for 2018-19 by contiguous districts was not available at the time the agenda was prepared.

Since at least 2011-12, the Board has adopted nonresident tuition rates consistent with option 5, although in some years more than one option may yield the same result. With the exception of 2017-18, when option 1 was higher and 2014-15 when both options yielded \$193, option 5 has been higher than option 1, the District's CEE. Without contiguous district information, the range for 2018-19 is \$230 to \$258 as option 6 is not consistent with the District's interest to provide access to non-resident students to augment the diversity of our students. The recommendation is to select option 5 at \$258 per unit.

B. Capital Outlay Fee:

In addition to the nonresident tuition fee, Education Code 76141 authorizes districts to charge nonresident students a capital outlay fee not to exceed the prior year's expenditures for capital outlay per unit of instruction. The District's building program was less in 2016-17, the calculated capital outlay fee for 2018-19 is \$13 per unit, which is the maximum rate that may be used. It is recommended that the capital outlay fee be set at the rate of \$13 for 2018-19.

Historical data regarding nonresident tuition and international student capital outlay fee and other informational schedules are attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt for 2018-19, a nonresident tuition fee rate of \$258 per unit effective for the summer 2018 term. In addition, it is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt for 2018-19, the student capital outlay fee of \$13 per unit to be assessed to all nonresident students also effective for the summer 2018 term.

BACKGROUND:

Program Development Funds, also referred to as PDF or 20% funds, are the District's discretionary funds for allocation to continuing and one-time-only purposes. The funds are comprised of both prior and current year resources per established formulas. Schedule I summarizes the funds available for the 2017-18 allocation. The overall guidelines for PDF allocations are: 1) to be responsive to the District/Colleges' planning process and related goals and objectives; 2) to address any current or future emphases directed by the Governing Board; 3) to fund mandates or new costs imposed upon the District; 4) to balance the distribution across District-wide needs; and 5) to maintain the District's conservative fiscal practices.

A key factor in the distribution of the funds is matching the type of resource (continuing or onetime-only) to the nature of the allocation. The type of revenue establishes or limits the type of expenditure that can be funded. For 2017-18, the District has \$3.1 million to allocate toward continuing costs. The primary sources of this year's continuing funds are the base augmentation and the cost of living adjustments (COLA). Due to our current enrollment trends, the District is not utilizing any growth funds from 2016-17 nor 2017-18 to support ongoing needs. The base augmentation is intended to help districts fund the increases in retirement contributions and the District is allocating a significant portion of the base increase for that purpose.

For 2017-18, over \$7.4 million is available for one-time general-purpose use as well as \$6.1 million in one-time funds from selected categorical program and special resources revenues. This is down from 2016-17 but still a significant amount that provides the capacity to continue our efforts to refresh infrastructure as well as make improvements in safety and security, information technology and other areas in support of the strategic plan.

STATUS:

Schedule II summarizes the allocations in support of the District's strategic goals. The allocation of continuing funds only is detailed on Schedule III. An important allocation this year is \$902,000 in continuing funds for increases in retirement contributions. This allocation was agreed to by the District and its employee groups last year where the compensation funds will contribute \$3.6 million from 2017-18 funding as well.

Another large appropriation of continuing funds is for classified staffing both in support of new positions as well as costs agreed to as part of negotiations. Although the District will realize savings in our electricity costs as a result of our agreement with SMUD, budget is needed for utilities to bring the allocation to last year's expended level which also includes additional funds for natural gas, water, and sewer costs.

General-purpose one-time funds were used to support multiple initiatives including additional safety and security and information technology projects, and other operational needs.

The resources and allocations have been reviewed by the District Budget Committee. The formal approval of the allocations will take place in February when the first budget revision for 2017-18 is brought to the Board.

BACKGROUND:

As part of the Awards for Innovation grant, Los Rios Community College District and Align Capital Region have been working on a regional student data exchange project. This informational item is an effort to keep members of the Board of Trustees apprised of the project progress and next steps

STATUS:

Align Capitol Region (ACR) has convened the project Alignment Team, which is made up of members across educational segments (i.e. K-12, Community College, CSUS, Community Partners) to explore data sharing solutions. The A-team met regularly over the fall semester to map out the California educational data landscape as it currently exist in an effort to identify where alignment gaps exist as it relates to data sharing. We have developed our Launch Canvas and a visual aid of the current data landscape. The A-team is moving rapidly through the first phase of the process and will begin viewing the potential solutions in spring 2018. We anticipate that UC representation will be finalized in spring 2018, which ensures the A-team has representation from all educational segments in our region.

RECOMMENDATION:
