The purpose of the MOU is to offer and expand dual enrollment opportunities for students who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education, with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for technical education.

Chancellor's Report:

ARC: ARC Geography Professor John Aubert was selected as the recipient of the California Geographical Society's 2018 "Outstanding Educator" award. This is a statewide award given annually to a college or university geography educator. This is considered the highest honor a California community college geography educator can receive. The award was given in conjunction with the 72nd Annual California Geographical Society Conference held April 27-29 at Cosumnes River College, and attended by approximately 300 students, faculty, and administrators from over 30 colleges and universities across the state, as well as Nevada, Illinois, and Michigan.

<u>CRC</u>: The CRC solar boat, in which students from the construction and engineering programs collaborated, took home first place in this year's SMUD Solar Regatta Sprint Race. 17 colleges came to compete at the annual event, which is held each May at Rancho Seco. The students rigged up a custom Huki kayak with photovoltaic panels and an electric motor to focus on the sprint event. In a head-to-head matchup with UC Davis, CRC pulled ahead to clinch the first place win by one second to win the Sprint Cup.

<u>FLC:</u> Folsom Lake College's Work Experience & Internship Program continues to flourish with the placement of its students with local, state, and global industry partners in both the public and private sectors. This past year, FLC students were placed with the Drug Enforcement Agency, the Office of Governor Jerry Brown, El Dorado County's Special Investigations Division, City of Sacramento Councilmember Allen Warren's office, Entercom Communications, Sacramento

Faces Race, and with a multitude of state departments. Other notable highlights include two of the three coveted Intel summer internships going to FLC students and the expansion of the college's highly successful partnership with Dignity Health's Mercy Hospital of Folsom, now in its third year, to also include opportunities with in-patient admitting, the family birthing center, the recovery room, and radiology.

SCC: On Thursday, June 7, Mayor Darrell Steinberg held a press conference at SCC to announce his economic vision for the city. His #AllInSac campaign aims to address the socio-economic disparities between neighborhoods by pushing for sales tax hike Measure U that will be on the November ballot. Press, community members and city leaders filled the room in PAC 106 as the mayor described the inequities and missed opportunities he sees in different neighborhoods in Sacramento. SCC President Michael Gutierrez and Sac State President Robert Nelsen were among the guests seated on stage behind the podium. "We have shortchanged youth investments and community-based organizations in our city for years," Steinberg said. "It's time to change that reality."
