Chancellor's Report:

ARC: ARC's Vocal Jazz Ensemble, under the direction of Dr. Art LaPierre, won its 5th consecutive national title this summer in the category of Top Community College Vocal Jazz Ensemble (Small Vocal Jazz Group category) for Downbeat Magazine, the premier jazz and blues magazine since 1934. The outstanding soloist was named as ARC student Cody Quakenbush for his vocals on "Caravan".

<u>CRC</u>: CRC alumni, Jeremy Wayland and Toby Momtaz, recently won Emmy's for work on videos they did for CHP and KVIE respectively. Current CRC employee, Mike Bittner, also an RTVF alum, worked on Jeremy's Emmy winning video!

Toby won an Emmy for the 11th episode of Yes! We're Open in the Information/Instructional-Program/Special category. The episode profiles successful entrepreneurs: the woman behind a Thai restaurant in Sacramento, a Stockton furniture maker, the co-founder of Fleet Feet, and a Folsom dance school owner.

FLC: Folsom Lake College, the Community Observatory, and KVIE partnered to present a special community event on June 27 at the El Dorado Center in honor of the 50th anniversary of the first Moon landing by Apollo 11 on July 20, 1969. 100 local space enthusiasts were treated to a preview of the PBS documentary by Robert Stone, Chasing the Moon, which featured a diverse cast of individuals who played key roles in the historical events around the Space Race of the 1950s and '60s. Attendees then got a unique behind-the-scenes take by Sacramento's own Rocket Men, guest speakers Don Brincka and Richard Serrano, who built and tested the NASA Saturn V rocket engines used by Apollo 11 out of the Sacramento Test Center in Rancho Cordova. The collaborative event concluded with docent-led stargazing at the on-campus Community Observatory.

SCC: Gov. Gavin Newsom visited SCC on Monday, July 1 to hold a press conference on the "Affordability Budget," which includes \$280 million earmarked for programs that would help people pay for college. Highlights include two years tuition-free community college for most students, \$1,000 tax credit for working families, and one additional month of paid family leave. Additionally, \$2.4 million will be allocated to create a new Student Basic Needs & Veterans Resource Center at SCC!
