


BACKGROUND:

On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361, which amended the Brown Act to provide local legislative bodies the ability to conduct virtual meetings under certain circumstances. The legislation included an urgency clause, which made it effective immediately.

AB 361 allows local legislative bodies to conduct virtual meetings during a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor under certain conditions, including when “state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.”

If the state of emergency is ongoing, the local legislative body must adopt certain findings by majority vote every thirty days in order to continue using the virtual meeting rules under AB 361.

On January 6, 2022, the Sacramento County Public Health Officer issued an order “Directing all Public Meetings in the County to Occur Virtually Until Further Notice and Encouraging Workplaces to Conduct Meetings Remotely as Business Needs Permit,” which provides in part:

“All public boards, councils, commissions, and other similar bodies shall suspend in-person public meetings and conduct all meetings virtually. Affected bodies shall ensure opportunities for virtual public participation and compliance with the Brown Act and other relevant statutes.”

The stated purpose of the January 6, 2022 Public Health Order is to “control and reduce the rate of community spread and to reinforce the need for safe interactions.” The Order notes that “in addition to existing COVID-19 mitigation measures, including vaccination and face coverings, additional actions can help limit the likelihood of COVID-19 transmission in workplaces and public settings.”

RECOMMENDATION:

Consistent with the Sacramento County Public Health Officer’s Order dated January 6, 2022, it is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the finding “that state or local officials continue to impose or recommend social distancing measures.”

Chancellor's Report:

Chancellor King acknowledged the hard work of the Board, faculty, and staff over the last twenty months of the pandemic and addressed the access and enrollment goals of the coming year which were discussed at last week's board study session. He also took a moment to thank the Trustees and many of the districtwide leaders for the phenomenal job they've all done during these challenging times.

The report below from the colleges was shared with the Board electronically.

ARC: ARC's men's soccer and volleyball teams both competed at the highest level possible earlier this month: the California Community College Athletic Association State Championships. Men's soccer fell just short, losing 2-1 to eventual state champion Mt. San Antonio College in the first round. The squad made it to the state Final Four tournament by winning three regional playoff matches. Volleyball upset favored Bakersfield in the first round of the state tournament before falling to West Valley College in the Final Four. The Beavers earned their trip to the state tournament with a pair of regional playoff wins, including a road upset of Sierra College. ARC is very proud of its Beavers!

CRC: Fifty (50) CRC students will receive an annual subscription to MasterClass, an American online education subscription platform on which students can access tutorials and lectures pre-recorded by experts in various fields. A year ago, Photography Professor Jim West was looking for a way to serve CRC students better by learning outside the classroom and applied for a grant from the MasterClass organization. Last week, he learned that CRC would be getting 50 free annual memberships to offer those students who could benefit from the classes and who would normally not be able to afford the cost. Those students who receive a membership will be able to access an unlimited number of classes for the year.

FLC: Folsom Lake College Mathematics Professor Wayne Jensen has successfully completed the Racial Equity in Mathematics Leadership Institute offered by the University of Southern California Race and Equity Center. The Institute seeks to involve math faculty in California's community colleges in a series of learning and leadership opportunities to advance equity-minded reform of mathematics pedagogy. Jensen was nominated for the program due to his demonstrated commitment to the success of Black, Latinx, Native American, Asian, and Pacific Islander students in introductory transfer-level mathematics courses. With the valuable insights and practical tools he learned as part of the Institute, along with his personal student success and equity data

available through the FLC Faculty Data Dashboard, Jensen plans to reflect on and adjust how he engages students and prepares course materials to help address any equity gaps.

SCC: Dr. Miguel Molina, Dean of Connection and Onboarding at Sacramento City College, has received the Mexican government's highest award given to individuals who have opened pathways to Mexicans abroad, specifically in the United States. Dr. Molina was presented with the Ohtli Award recently at a ceremony held by the Mexican Consulate in Sacramento. The prestigious recognition, he says, "means the most to me for the disproportionate students who I have served, who were predominantly low income, first generation and who often faced barriers from reaching their dreams through higher education but who have instead met the challenge and gone on to become professionals, mentors, educators and role models for the generations behind them."



BACKGROUND:

The Los Rios Colleges and the Los Rios Colleges Foundation receive various in-kind gifts for use in the District’s instructional programs and other support areas. Annually, the Foundation transfers title for these in-kind items to the District. Per Board Policy 8254, the Board of Trustees may accept, on behalf of the District, such gifts.

STATUS:

American River College has received an offer from long-time donors who wish to donate property to the college. The property is .89 acres of vacant commercial land located at 4750 Myrtle Avenue, Sacramento, in Sacramento County, California (APN # 240-0062-073). The environmental report revealed no recognized environmental conditions. It has been appraised at a value of \$660,000.



BACKGROUND:

The Long Range Capital Needs Plan and local bond Measure M includes funds for transportation, access and parking (TAP). The ARC Natomas Parking Expansion Project (Project) will provide an additional 245 parking stalls on a vacant parcel of land immediately adjacent the Natomas Center (Center). The Project will support the upcoming expansion of the Center with the construction of Phase 2 and 3. In addition to parking stalls, the Project includes 8 EV charging stations, 2 code blue emergency phones, security camera system, 2 drive up ticket machines and a storm water retention basin. The Planning Department worked with local engineer Kier & Wright on the design as well as coordinating with Natomas Joint Unified School District who will construct softball fields on the north end of the project site.

STATUS:

The plans and specifications for Bid 22007 were publicly advertised for bids. Bidders were asked to provide a total bid amount. A total of 4 responsive bids were received.

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

BACKGROUND:

After each decennial U.S. Census, local public agencies with officers selected by or from geographical districts must “redistrict.” This requires review of the recent Census population data and, if necessary, adjustment of voting area boundaries to keep them as nearly equal in population as possible, allowing for certain variances due to geography, topography, communities of interest, and other factors, all as required by state and federal law. Los Rios elects trustees by trustee area and is required to follow this redistricting process.

At the December 15, 2021 meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Board and the public were provided an overview of the redistricting process, the District’s existing trustee area boundaries, and potential trustee area boundary changes in light of the recent federal census. At the December 15, 2021 meeting, the Board provided initial feedback to the District’s demographer, Redistricting Partners, related to potential trustee area boundaries.

STATUS:

Redistricting Partners created draft maps for the Board’s consideration based on the initial feedback received at the December 15, 2021 meeting, an analysis of the 2020 census data, existing maps, and population demographics. The draft map proposals, along with other information related to the redistricting process, are available on the District’s redistricting website: <https://losrios.edu/redistricting>. The draft map proposals were posted for public review and input on the District’s redistricting website on January 5, 2022.

A public hearing will be held to obtain input from members of the public on the proposed draft trustee area maps. The draft trustee area maps will then be presented to the Board for its consideration, discussion, and feedback. Based on feedback received, final maps will be presented to the Board for consideration and adoption at its February 2022 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees receive the presentation on the draft trustee area maps, hold a public hearing on the draft trustee area maps, provide input on the draft maps to staff and the District’s redistricting consultant, and direct staff to bring final trustee area maps to the Board at its February meeting for consideration and adoption.
