






Clarifying the Path






We removed confusion as to what path to pursue by developing Career and Academic Communities (CAC's, metamajors) and program maps for our 200+ programs.

Entering the Path






We reduced barriers to enrollment and onboarding

Staying on the Path






We implemented a case management student support model and developed Student Success Teams, designated program counselors and success coaches, and Teaching and Learning Leads (TII's)

- Open for Anti-Racism (OFAR)




Achievements to Date

- Increase in the Percent of Recent high school students enrolling in 15 units
 - from 13% in Fall 2018 to 26% in Fall 2023
 - even more impactful for our Black students (from 12% to 19%) and Latinx students (from 9% to 27%)
- Spring 2024 had the highest success rate since 2010: 72%
- Transfer rate more than doubled since 2016
- Award completion doubled since 2016
- Zero Textbook Cost/Open Educational Resources

 76% of our course offerings are ZTC in Fall 2024

Our Work Is Not Done

- Persistent racial inequities
 - College-wide course success rate for Fall 2023 was 70%
 - Black students: 55.6%
 - Latinx students: 65.5%
- Variation within the same course in Fall 2022 among 165 faculty
 - Median difference was 16.5 percentage points
 - Largest difference was 53.6 percentage points

Collaboration and Partnership

- CRC Academic Senate
 - Recognized the need for conversation
 - Researching trends for what may/may not be barriers or unintended challenges for students.
 - Engaging in meaningful conversation with college leadership
- Teaching and Learning Leads
 - Dedicated support for faculty
 - Engage faculty in data conversations
 - by spring 2024: 33.3% of adjunct faculty and 64.3% of full time faculty accessed their course success data
