SUBJECT: CCCT BOARD ELECTION — 2026

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Pursuant to the CCCT Board Governing Policies, the election of members of the CCCT Board of the League will take place between March 10 and April 25. This year there are nine (9) seats up for election, with six (6) incumbents running.

Each community college district governing board shall have one vote for each of the nine seats on the CCCT Board. Only one vote may be cast for any nominee or write-in candidate. The four candidates who receive the most votes will serve a three-year term.

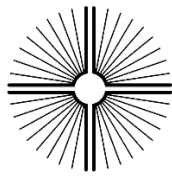

Voting will be conducted via eBallot, thus no sample ballot is included. Voting instructions will be sent to governing board assistants closer to the start of the voting period.
