

**LOS RIOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT**  
**Student Advisory Committee (SAC) Meeting Minutes**  
**Wednesday, December 17, 2025**

**1. PROCEDURAL ITEMS**

The meeting was called to order by Trustee Pham at 3:34 p.m., in the Main Conference Room at the Los Rios Community College District Office, 1919 Spanos Court, Sacramento, CA.

The agenda was adopted as presented with no objections.

Minutes from the November 12, 2025 meeting were approved.

**2. REPORTS**

**1. Student Trustee Report**

Trustee Pham shared updates regarding the selection of a new Chancellor for the District. She reported continued outreach efforts to increase student participation on district committees and noted that Sacramento City College representatives will complete required remote meeting training.

**2. Student Leadership and Development Educators (SLADE) Advisor Report**

Advisor Anaya reported that planning for Spring semester meetings is underway. She emphasized the importance of informing newly appointed student leaders about updated Brown Act requirements under SB 707.

### 3. District Advisor Report

Advisor Ortiz-Mercado shared updates on the incoming Chancellor and upcoming district regulations. She shared improvements to financial aid processes, including automatic transmission of AP test scores to individual colleges. Preparations are also underway for the upcoming student election cycle.

### 4. American River College Report

President Amin reported increased student engagement within the Student Senate. Updates included a food accessibility survey regarding Pacific Dining, student government stipends, and allocation of Student Senate funds.

### 6. Folsom Lake College Report

Vice President Khuc, Folsom Lake College designee, reported student Senate members' attendance at the SSCCC Advocacy Academy in Riverside and selection of preliminary Lobby Day topic recommendations. The campus also hosted food and clothing drives to support students.

### 7. Sacramento City College Report

President Petueli reported that the campus toy drive collected 125 toys and welcomed approximately 110 students during Thanksgiving week programming. "Hughie Holiday" brought together students, families, and community members for engagement activities. Scholarships were distributed to undocumented students, and a new Student Senate member was appointed. Representatives from SCC and FLC attended the Advocacy Academy.

## **4. NEW BUSINESS & ACTION ITEMS**

### 1. Lobby Day Priority Issues — Discussion & Vote

A motion was made by President Petueli to discuss and select the top two Lobby Day advocacy priorities. President Amin seconded the motion.

Each campus presented its top advocacy priorities:

- Sacramento City College:
  1. Artificial Intelligence regulations for students and faculty
  2. Improved counselor-to-student ratios
  3. Support for international students
- Folsom Lake College:
  1. Basic needs (housing, food, transportation, childcare)
  2. Government funding backfills
  3. Economic and workforce training
- American River College:
  1. Student housing support and emergency grants
  2. Support for undocumented students
  3. Transportation

Members voted on their preferred Lobby Day advocacy priorities:

- Artificial Intelligence: President Petueli
- Counselor Advocacy: President Amin, President Petueli
- Basic Needs: President Amin, Vice President Khuc
- Economic & Workforce Training: President Amin, Vice President Khuc

Basic Needs and Counselor Advocacy were selected as the top two Lobby Day priorities.

Motion carried.

## 3. ARC Associated Students Resolution on Student Stipends — Presentation & Discussion

President Amin presented ARC's resolution passed in May supporting student stipends. She explained that Student Representation Fee (SRF) funds may be used for stipends. The resolution was presented to the Academic Senate and Financial Aid Office, where concerns were raised regarding potential impacts on students' financial aid packages.

Advisor Brett noted that leftover ASB fee funds could support clubs on campus. Advisor Anaya shared that CRC is currently the only campus providing stipends for Student Senate participation and does not need to notify Financial Aid. Advisor Tony recommended implementing the ASB fee during both Fall and Spring semesters.

## 4. Proposed LRCCD Regulation Changes: Academic Probation/Dismissal & GE Waiver

A motion was made by SCC to move this item to the next SAC meeting. ARC seconded the motion. The item was postponed.
