Students are encouraged to learn more, run for a position, attend candidate forums, and vote. Candidate statements are published as submitted by the candidate.

Our colleges are always looking for students interested in leadership development. If you are open to learning and working with others, then consider joining your college's student association.

How to Vote

There are no voting stations on campus. Students will be able to vote from any computer or mobile device with internet access on April 22 and April 23, from 8:00 am to 11:30 pm each day. For more information please visit: lostrios.edu/elections. To cast your vote:

- 1. Go to your eServices account.
- 2. Click on the Elections & Surveys tab. Elections tab is only available during voting period.
- 3. Read the Voter Guide. The guide includes each candidate's Statement of Intent that includes their interest in serving in a specific position, issues or concerns they plan to address while in the position, and their leadership qualifications. The statements are presented without grammatical edits.
- 4. Proceed to the Voting Site and VOTE!

Why You Should Vote

Voting in the student elections is a privilege available only to Los Rios students who are currently enrolled. Voting only takes a few minutes of your time, and elected student leaders make lasting changes to the campus environment and student experience.

Role of the Student Association

The student association is the official organization that represents students and consists of the Clubs and Events Board (CAEB) and Student Senate. Sacramento City College Student Associated Council Constitutional Amendment

Any change to the Student Associated Council Constitution must be approved by a vote of the student body, after the Council has approved the change to go forward to a vote. The proposed change is to add the following:

ARTICLE X: Responsible Use of Artificial Intelligence in Student Government Section

X.01 Purpose

The Student Associated Council (SAC) recognizes the growing role of artificial intelligence (AI) in academic and professional settings. While AI can be a valuable tool, it must be used in a way that upholds the integrity, accountability, and human leadership that SAC represents. This section establishes guidelines for the ethical and responsible use of AI by SAC members.

Section X.02 Permitted Uses of AI

- 1. AI may be used as a supplementary tool for tasks such as grammar and spell-checking, summarizing notes, scheduling, and improving the clarity of communication.
- 2. AI-generated content may be used for brainstorming and drafting, provided that the final decisions, revisions, and approvals are made by a student representative.
- 3. AI may be used for research purposes, such as gathering publicly available information or analyzing data relevant to SAC initiatives.

Section X.03 Prohibited Uses of AI

- 1. AI may not be used to fully generate official SAC policies, resolutions, or speeches without meaningful human input, revision, and oversight.
- 2. AI may not be used to make decisions on behalf of SAC or any of its members, including voting, committee recommendations, or disciplinary actions.
- 3. AI may not be used to impersonate, fabricate, or manipulate information in a way that misleads students, faculty, or council members.

Section X.04 Transparency and Accountability

- 1. Any SAC member who uses AI in official capacities, including drafting speeches, reports, or policy proposals, must disclose its use when submitting the final version.
- 2. AI involvement must be noted in meeting minutes or relevant documentation when it contributes to policy creation, public addresses, or official SAC communications.
