

Student Legal Services (SLS) Overview



What is SLS?



The program was *launched in 2019 by the California Department of Social Services* to cater to the immigration legal needs of students, staff, and faculty.

We provide free legal consultations, presentations, tabling, outreach, and fee assistance for a limited number of services.

Each school has a designated legal provider who works closely with the DreamCenter/Counselor to ensure that services are being utilized.

The **SLS team** consists of DOJ accredited representatives, paralegals, legal assistants, and Campus fellows, with staff in both NorCal and SoCal.

Education and Outreach



In addition to legal services, we *regularly visit campuses* to provide *in-person* legal *consultations* and *build our presence* on campus

Regular educational presentations on popular topics like DACA, Know-Your-Rights, SLS services, Advance Parole, etc.

Liaisons work with on-campus partners (usually Dreamer Resource Centers) to present in-person and virtually, usually as part of a clinic



Naturalization (also known as US citizenship)










When/where are consultations?







Virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursdays with 8 time slots every day.

In-person

consultations occur oncampus on weekdays, with the specific days determined by the college's needs.

Protect Yourself from Immigration Scams




Government impersonators: Look out for individuals who pose as USCIS officials. USCIS will only contact you through official government channels and will not contact you through your personal social media accounts (such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, etc.).

Scam Websites: Some websites claim to be affiliated with USCIS and offer step-by-step guidance on completing a USCIS application or petition. Make sure your information is from uscis.gov, dhs.gov, or is affiliated with uscis.gov. Make sure the website address ends with .gov.

Payments by Phone or Email: We will never ask you to transfer money to an individual. We do not accept Western Union, MoneyGram, PayPal, or gift cards as payment for immigration fees. In addition, we will never ask you to pay fees to a person on the phone or by email.

Notarios Públicos and unauthorized practitioners of immigration law: In the United States, a notario público is not authorized to provide you with any legal services related to immigration benefits. Only an attorney or an accredited representative working for a Department of Justice (DOJ)-recognized organization can give you legal advice.
